Non-Revenue Water Workshop

Non Revenue Water workshop was held in Avari, Lahore on 26-29 April, 2016. The objective of the workshop was to:

- Share the draft F-WASA PBC framework with larger fraternity of Pakistan utilities and experts to seek their input and;
- Raise the awareness about NRW among large urban utilities of Pakistan.

Mr. Gerard WB Specialist briefed on how the World Bank facilitates urban water utilities around the world in becoming sustainable and profitable organizations by systematically reducing NRW.

Mr. Roland WB expert presented the global and regional figures indicating that annually 8.6 Billion USD water losses are recorded in Asia of which 1.4 Billion USD worth of water losses happen in South Asia that warrant the urgent attention of stakeholders to address NRW in South Asian countries. Based on feasibility study conducted current NRW in F WASA is almost equivalent to 27,800 m³/day. The proposed PBC will target reducing the NRW equivalent to 15,000 m³/day which is sufficient to supply additional 150,000 people.



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VISION

To maximize the effectiveness of the urban water and sanitation utilities to deliver superior services, particularly

to the urban poor, such that the MDGs for water and sanitation are achieved.

MISSION

To foster the development and the improvements of urban W&S services through increased collaboration between utilities, civil society organizations, academia and government for advocacy, learning, networking and support partnerships among local and international peers.



PWON Steering Committee Meeting

PWON Steering Committee meeting held in Peshawar dated November 13, 2016 in which all the members and observers utilities participated. The focal persons of PWON of every utility were nominated. It was discussed that resource mapping will be done in which every utility will be required to give their technical experts for making PWON even better and sound. Various types of pipes were discussed. Those who had attended training in Tajikistan gave feed back of their visit and gave technical information. The SOPs about O&M of sewer system and sanitary staff designed by PWON were decided to be circulated in all utilities. It was decided that a mechanism will be designed to shift from ground water to surface water. Moreover, water safety standards would be made.



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KW&SB visit to WASA-F



Water and Sanitation Agency, Faisalabad hosted two day visit of Karachi Water and Sewerage Board with assistance of World Bank on 25th and 26th of February, 2016 in which it was discussed to cope with Non Revenue Water NRW. Helium gas method technique used by WASA-F was discussed. KW&SB shared their knowledge of Treatment Plants. WASA-F explained about master planning of Faisalabad being done with JICA. Moreover the progress regarding Citizen Liaison Cell was discussed. WASA-F briefed about meter installation in city and how it would improve revenue and operational efficiency. The techniques used in French Project were discussed.
